

Dig It!...Local Archaeology Workshop

Great Bay Community College is inviting you to find out about Historical Archaeology and offering an opportunity to get your hands dirty. This four class workshop includes a fun filled day onsite in Greenland at the 'Weeks' Brick House'. This circa 1710 brick dwelling was the home of prominent Greenland native Samuel Weeks. This official New Hampshire landmark is part of the original 1650's farmstead of Leonard Weeks.

The workshop will include an overview of archaeology in NH, a presentation of the necessary 'field methods', a day at the 'Dig' and a discussion of what was discovered and learned. Dr. Neill De Paoli, the consulting Archaeologist for the Weeks, Brick House and Gardens and Adjunct Professor at Southern Maine Community College, will lead the activities of what promises to be an exciting opportunity to get in touch with your past.

The workshop schedule starts with an overview of local archaeology and a 'how to' sessions on Tuesday, June 15, and Thursday, June 17, from 6:00 - 8:30pm at Great Bay Community College. On June 19 the class moves to an all day, 9:00am -3:00pm, dig onsite at the Weeks Brick House in Greenland, NH. The wrap-up session of cataloging what was discovered and discussing what was learned will be on Tuesday, June 22, from 6:00-8:30pm.
